RECOMMENDED SIGNS

1. Best practices for COVID-19 prevention will be posted by Petits Pas at all public entrances.
2. Get vaccinated will be posted by Petits Pas in staff areas.

STRATEGIES TO PREVENT SPREAD OF COVID-19 SITUATIONS

Promote COVID-19 vaccination

1. Petits Pas encourages COVID-19 vaccination for staff, children old enough to be vaccinated and family members.
2. Petits Pas limits non-essential visitors who are not fully vaccinated, including volunteers and activities involving external groups.
3. **Vaccination requirement for students 12+yo: following San Francisco County Authorities, all participants 12+yo are required to show proof of being fully vaccinated (including booster if eligible) against COVID-19 to participate in in-person activities, including classes, performances, and other events ([SF Gov info here](#)).**

Wear face masks indoor

1. Face masks are required indoors for everyone 2yo and older, even if they have been fully vaccinated for COVID-19.
2. Masks must be well-fitted and cover the mouth and nose.
3. Petits Pas will keep a supply of face masks for people who forget to bring their own.
4. Face masks are not required outdoors as the risk of transmission is low in most outdoor settings like Petits Pas camps.
5. Exemptions to face masks: Children under 24 months old must not wear face coverings due to the risk of suffocation. People who are unconscious, asleep, or unable to remove a face mask independently must not wear masks. For other exemptions to this requirement, see [CDPH Face Mask guidance](#).

Improve ventilation and use outdoor spaces as often as possible

1. Petits Pas will follow [CDPH Ventilation Guidance](#).
2. Petits Pas has the chance to run camps in very large indoor and outdoor spaces.
3. Petits Pas will do breaks (water breaks, morning/afternoon snacks, lunch) and some activities outside in the large patio.
4. Petits Pas uses portable air cleaners in each indoor space (“HEPA filters”).
5. Petits Pas staff will open windows to increase natural ventilation with outdoor air when health and safety allow. Petits Pas Staff will also let room doors slightly open to promote flow of outdoor air through the indoor space.
6. During wildfires or other times when air quality is poor, Petits Pas will prioritize maintaining healthy air quality indoors. Our program may remain open even if we need to close our windows or decrease outdoor air intake by our ventilation system during these times. Petits Pas will continue other precautions, especially wearing masks.

Petits Pas will ask students to stay home when sick after home-based symptom checks

1. Petits Pas will provide a list of COVID-19 symptoms to staff and families of children. Petits Pas will make sure they know to stay home if they have symptoms. SFDPH has created a sample handout for families available [here](#).
2. Petits Pas will encourage family members of children and staff to get tested promptly if they have symptoms of COVID-19. This will lower the risk of infection spreading to people in our program.
3. SFDPH does not recommend temperature checks anymore.
4. Petits Pas will encourage staff, children and youth who are not fully vaccinated for COVID-19 to [quarantine and test after travel](#), and to follow CDC recommendations for travel.

Petits Pas will follow recommended hand hygiene

1. Petits Pas will follow pre-COVID-19 universal health precautions for handwashing. This document is available [here](#).
2. Petits Pas will teach and reinforce the importance of washing hands, avoiding contact with one's eyes, nose, and mouth, and covering coughs and sneezes among children and staff.
3. Petits Pas will promote hand washing throughout the day, especially before and after eating, after using the toilet, after handling garbage, after wiping noses/coughing/sneezing.
4. Petits Pas will make sure staff and children have supplies to clean their hands, including soap, paper towels, and/or hand sanitizer with at least 60 percent ethyl alcohol for staff and children who can safely use hand sanitizer.
5. Petits Pas will keep hand sanitizer out of the reach of young children and supervise use.

Cleaning and disinfection protocols

1. Cleaning once a day is usually enough to remove potential virus that may be on surfaces.
2. Paper-based materials like books and magazines do not need cleaning between uses.
3. Outdoor props & equipment do not need cleaning and disinfection between groups.
4. Additional disinfection is recommended only if a person with COVID-19 was present within the last 24 hours; Spaces occupied by that person during that time must be cleaned AND disinfected. Click [here](#) for more information:

Cohorting is not required

1. Staff and volunteers may work with more than one group and there is no maximum group size.
2. Children may participate in more than one group each day.
3. Single-day programs and drop-in programs are now allowed. Programs can add new children and youth at any time.

Physical distancing is no longer required by SFPDPH

Physical distancing is no longer required. Because of the importance of in-person learning, CDC, CDPH, and SFPDPH do not recommend physical distancing if it will limit full enrollment.

SPECIFIC SITUATIONS

Carpools and share rides

1. Petits Pas will tell staff and families to try to carpool with the same stable group of people.
2. Petits Pas will tell staff and families to open windows, to turn the fan on high, and set to outdoor air.

Meals/snacks/water breaks

1. Petits Pas will make sure that water breaks/lunch/snacks are taken outside.

Drop-off and pick-up for children enrolled in our program

1. Drop-off and pick-up will be curbside. Meet the staff at the main entrance of the Camp location.
2. Petits Pas encourages parents/caregivers to stay outside at drop-off and pick-up to prevent the spread of Covid-19.
3. The first day of camp, parents/caregivers may enter the building briefly for drop-off, even if they are not fully vaccinated for COVID-19.

Sharing

1. Petits Pas staff will make sure there is no sharing of drink bottles and other personal items.
2. Children and youth can use shared supplies and equipment such as mats, barre, props. Petits Pas staff will clean shared equipment every day after camp.

WHAT TO DO WHEN SOMEONE HAS COVID-19 SYMPTOMS, INFECTION, OR EXPOSURE

When Petits Pas staff, children and youth become ill at the program

1. Staff who become ill at work must notify Petits Pas and leave work as soon as they can.
2. Petits Pas staff will send SICK children at home. Petits Pas staff will keep those who are waiting to be picked up in a designated isolation room. Petits Pas staff will make sure that they keep their face masks on.

Steps Petits Pas will follow if someone reports a positive test or has symptoms of COVID-19

1. Petits Pas will follow the Guide to COVID-19 Infections, Symptoms and Exposures at Schools and Programs for Children for what to do if someone tests positive for COVID-19 or has symptoms of COVID-19.
2. Petits Pas must and will report COVID-19 cases to SFDPH at cases.schools@sfdph.org. SFDPH staff will work Petits Pas on case management and provide input on next steps, including isolation, quarantine, and outbreak management.

When a child reports an exposure to COVID-19 outside of school or program

1. It is no longer necessary to require children exposed to COVID-19 outside of the school or program to quarantine at home. If they are asymptomatic, they may return immediately and recommend testing 3-5 days after the exposure.
2. It is **strongly recommended** that exposed children over age 2 wear a well-fitting mask whenever feasible for 10 days after exposure and particularly when around others indoors.

3. If children become symptomatic, they should isolate at home immediately until their symptoms start to improve and their test result is known.
4. For continual exposures, such as those in the household where the child is not isolating away from the person with COVID-19, asymptomatic children are allowed to return to the program throughout the duration of exposure. It is reasonable to recommend testing once 3-5 after initial exposure and, if the test is negative, repeat testing again 3-5 days after the first test. If both tests are negative, no further testing is recommended as long as child remains asymptomatic.
